Q: What do you love most about working in libraries?


A: I love interacting with the patrons. When a new member joins the Library I like to let them know all there is to offer, from books to online streaming to in-person programs and so much more.

Q: If you could tell people one thing about the SDG Library, what would it be?


A: Check it out. There is something for everyone!

Q: What are you reading right now?




